

Images are arranged in route order, whether or not the images were shot on the same day. An arrow on any image indicates the shooting direction for the image concerned, when not in the direction of travel. That could be facing backwards down the trail or any other direction. This helps resolve the issue of shooting into the sun. The main purpose of this document is to capture an impression of route characteristics, so people can make choices based on the information. It is not intended to be an independent illustrated route guide or a portfolio of landscape images.



At the start of the track turn off. All images dated: 26.04



On the climb keeping the wall on your left. Boardwalks and boggy bits which could deliver Black Darter Dragonflies in season.



Looking back down the trail.



The old abandoned barn, often surrounded by boggy ground.



Another glance backwards.



Crossing the A54.



This is a useful route for views on the right day in the right conditions.



Start of the first route sometimes used by dirt bikes. Not seen any off-peak.



En-route to Three shire Heads.



Sandstone pebbles underfoot on the main path but there are adjacent smooth paths in some places.



Three shir Heads waterfalls. Visit off-peak to get images and video.



Back on track.



Starting the climb to Holt Farm. Take the track straight ahead.



A Wheatear (*Oenanthe oenanthe*) seen on this part of the route.



Near the top of the climb back to the A54.



Crossing the A54.



On the trail back to Cumberland Cottage and Clough House. Route one holds more detail.



Once you arrive at Clough House, follow Clough Road back to the car park. You could of course start and end at this car park.
